Content

- ✓ Understand what's being asked
 - Thoroughly read the Applicant Guide and revisit regularly to best understand what is required for each question.
 - Answer the question being asked and be sure to include who, what, when, where, and why in your application.
 - Re-read the question after answering it to ensure you've fully addressed it.
- ✓ Clearly communicate your short-term vision and why it's important, connecting it to your long-term vision
 - Make connections to the barriers your solution addresses and how it is going to address them.
 - Your application should be clear on how this solution is a step towards your long-term vision. Walk the reader through your thinking; "if this _____, then this _____".
 - Provide context, emphasizing why your solution is important to the community, and how it addresses housing supply chain and affordability barriers. Keep in mind that the reader might not be familiar with your community and the barriers it faces, so be sure to speak to the barriers directly.
- ✓ Familiarize yourself with the evaluation criteria and how much each section of the application is allocated and match your time and efforts.
- ✓ Promote yourself and your solution!

Budget

- ✓ Make sure your budget is accurate and comprehensive.
 - The budget should reflect the workplan – larger project elements will have higher budgets.
 - Consider factors such as labour costs, shipping costs, price fluctuations/inflation, in-kind support, risk mitigation. Have your costs accurately evaluated.
 - Anticipate hidden costs and build in a realistic buffer.
- ✓ Make sure your budget reflects realistic goals and timelines.
 - Be careful not to over-promise on the delivery of your solution.
